<u>RANGE HOST PROGRAM</u>

<u>MARCH WORK PARTY</u>

The initial holdup was with the BLM giving us approval to dig the holes for the vaults. Once this was done, and the vaults were put in, we had a problem with the buildings getting put up. This was done in two stages and the final holdup was the weather. We had to wait for the weather to warm up enough to install the toilets with the sealant required. Both of the new toilets will be outfitted with toilets, urinals and motion lights. Both of them were built extremely well and if you go in without a light, you probably could not find your way out.

The new Shotgun area was cleaned up and improved and we will be getting that back in operation soon. Clay throwers are on order and will be put in at the next work party.

General cleanup was done, and the garbage picked up as usual. We still need help between monthly work parties to keep the range trash cans emptied. It would certainly help if members would empty the trash cans when they get full at the different ranges. All you need to do is to pull out the plastic sack and tie it off and put it in the trash tailer. New plastic sacks are in the back room of the lunch trailer.

We are though the worst part of the winter, and we hope the winds are not as strong as they have been. Therefore, the US flags have been put up for all to see.
